



2011 Census Bulletin

Language in Simcoe County

This bulletin summarizes data collected from the 2011 Census for information regarding language in Simcoe County. The Census reflects a diverse community within this region, comprised of different skills, cultural influences, and geographic areas. Residents of Simcoe County reported more than 100 non-official mother tongues in 2011, 88,7% of Simcoe County residents reported English as their mother tongue, and 1,0% have more than one mother tongue. Please note that before 2011, language information was only on the long-form census sent to 20% of Canadians. Language information is now sent to all Canadians through the short-form census. This makes it difficult to compare the 2011 Census to previous census years.





Summary

In 2011, 92.9% of Simcoe County residents had knowledge of English only, 6.6% had knowledge of English and French, 0.4% had no knowledge of either language, and 0.1% had knowledge of only French.

Out of 436,915 single responses, 88.7% of Simcoe County residents reported only English as their mother tongue, and 2.5% reported only French. There were a total of 38,470 (8.8%) people who reported a non-official language as their mother tongue.

Of the non-official mother tongue languages, 13.4% reported German. Some of the other non-official mother tongues reported in Simcoe County include Italian (12.6%), Portuguese (9.8%), Polish (7.7%), Spanish (6.7%), Dutch (6.6%), and Chinese (4.4%).

96.2% of Simcoe County residents reported speaking English, while 0.8% spoke French, and 2.9% spoke a non-official language. The top five non-official languages spoken at home in Simcoe County out of single response answers were Portuguese (11.8%), Italian (9.1%), Polish (9.0%), Spanish (8.6%), and Chinese (8.5%)

Only 6,130 Simcoe County residents spoke more than one language. 86.3% spoke English and a non-official language, 11.9% spoke English and French, 1.2% spoke English, French, and a non-official language, and 0.5% spoke French and a non-official language.
