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Key Points

- The median household total income of Simcoe County rose by 3.7%, from \$73,740 in 2005 to \$76,489 in 2015.
- The median individual income of Simcoe County rose by 3.4%, from \$32,987 in 2005 to \$34,100 in 2015.
- Bradford West Gwillimbury (+ 48.2%) and Wasaga Beach (+ 41.6%) had the highest growth in the number of total income recipients in Simcoe County over the past decade.
- In 2015, the median economic family income in Simcoe County was \$89,613. Economic couple families with children had a median income of \$114,750 – the highest among all economic family types.
- In Simcoe County, the overall low-income rate was 11.4% in 2015, a 1.6% increase from 9.8% in 2005.
- In 2015, 15.0% of children aged 17 years old and younger lived in low-income households, compared with 9.6% of seniors aged 65 years old and over.

Household Income¹

The following table provides further detail on the median household income and the change of median household income in the Simcoe County Census Division and Municipalities (Census Subdivisions) from 2005 to 2015. The median household total income in Simcoe County was \$76,489 in 2015, a 3.7% increase from \$73,740 in 2005¹. Oro-Medonte (+ 16.8%) and Severn (+ 13.0%) had the highest growth in the median household total income for private households over the decade. Tiny (-4.4%) and Wasaga Beach (-3.1%) had the greatest decline in the median household total income from 2005¹ to 2015.

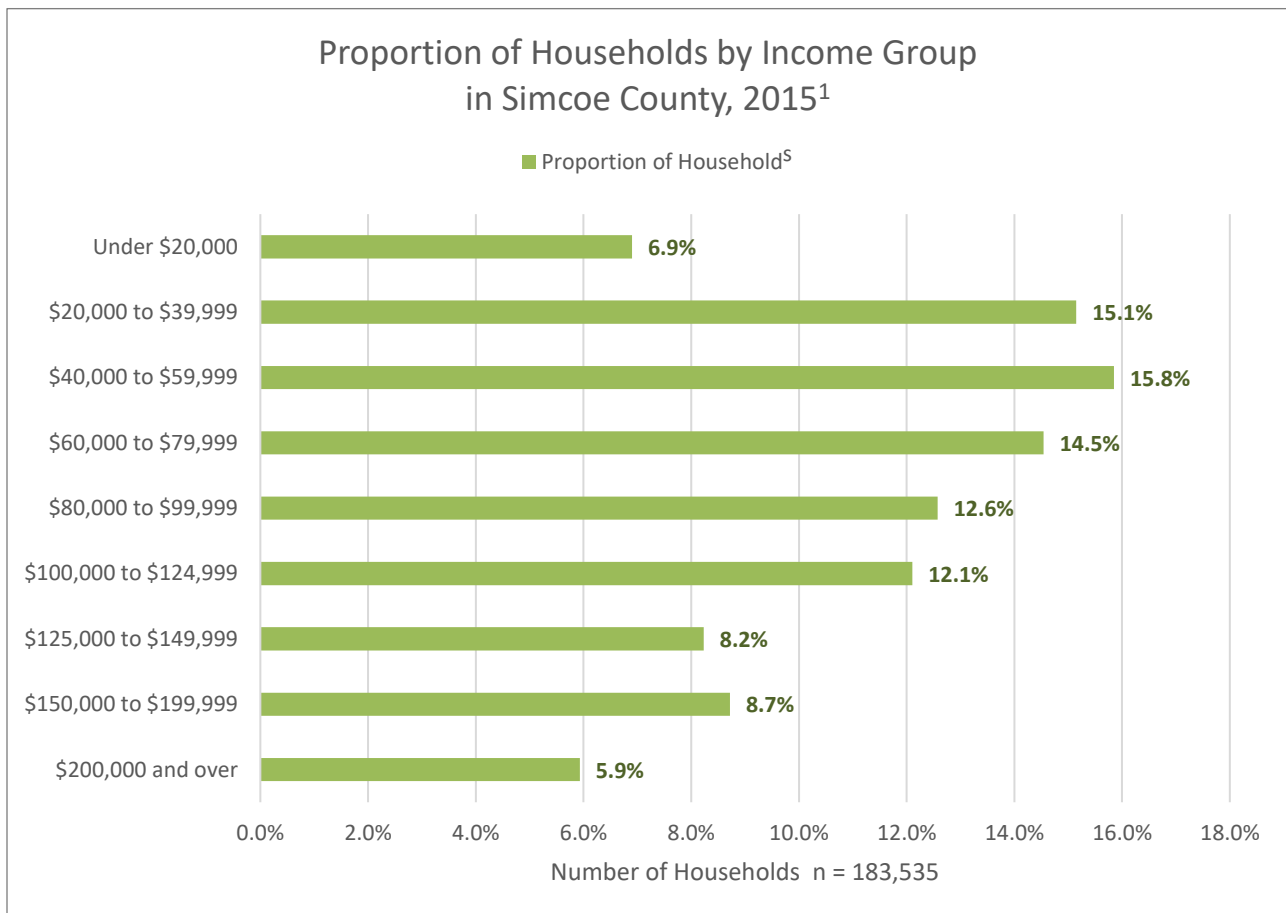

Simcoe County - Median Household Income by Income Group

The chart below provides an overview of income distribution for median household total income in Simcoe County in 2015. Among the income groups in Simcoe County, 6.9% had median household total income under \$20,000 in 2015.

In Simcoe County, 15.8% of households had total annual income between \$40,000 and \$59,999, 15.1% of households had income between \$20,000 and \$39,999, and 14.5% of households reported having total income between \$60,000 and \$79,999 in 2015.

Simcoe County

The table below provides data on individual income for the population aged 15 years old and over in Simcoe County from 2005¹ to 2015. The median individual income of Simcoe County rose from \$32,987 in 2005¹ to \$34,100 in 2015 (+ 3.4%).

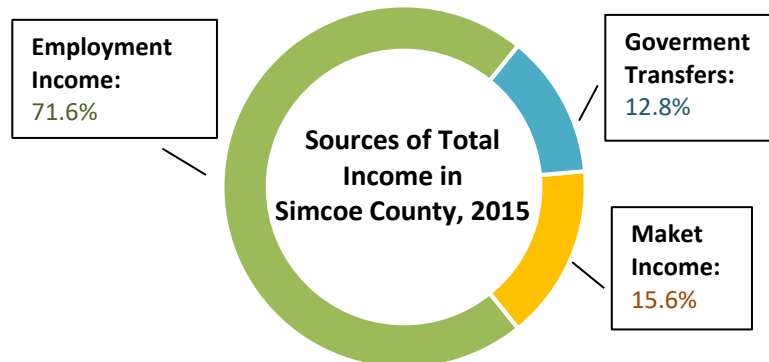

Composition of Individual Income Sources* in Simcoe County, 2015

In Simcoe County, residents earn a greater share of their income from employment income. 71.6% of Simcoe residents' total income came from employment income in 2015, 15.6% of total income came from market income excluded employment, and 12.8% of income relied on government transfers.

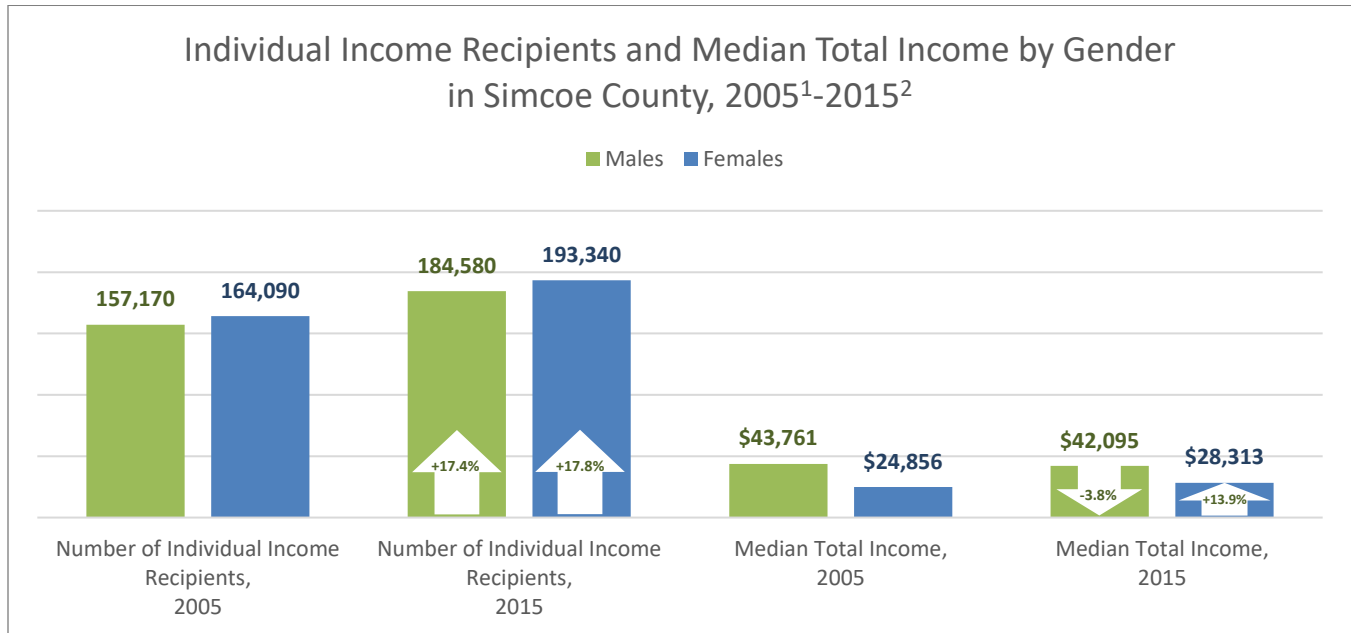
Individual Income by Gender

The chart below presents the number of Individual Income recipients and median total income by gender in Simcoe County in 2005 and 2015.

In Simcoe County, the number of female income recipients was higher than male income recipients over the past decade. The population of female income recipients rose from 164,090 in 2005 to 193,340 in 2015 (+17.8%). The population of male income recipients rose from 157,170 in 2005 to 184,580 in 2015 (+17.4%).

However, the median total income of female was lower than male in Simcoe County over the past decade. The median total income of female increased from \$24,856 in 2005¹ to \$28,313 in 2015 (+13.9%). The median total income of male decreased from \$43,761 in 2005¹ to \$42,095 in 2015 (-3.8%).

Men are more likely to be the higher income recipients compared with women. In Simcoe County, males had a median total individual income of \$42,095, and females had a median total income of \$28,313. The gap between these figures are getting smaller and decreased from \$18,905 in 2005¹ to \$13,782 in 2015 (-27.1%). This gap is higher than the median gap in Ontario with a difference of \$11,213.

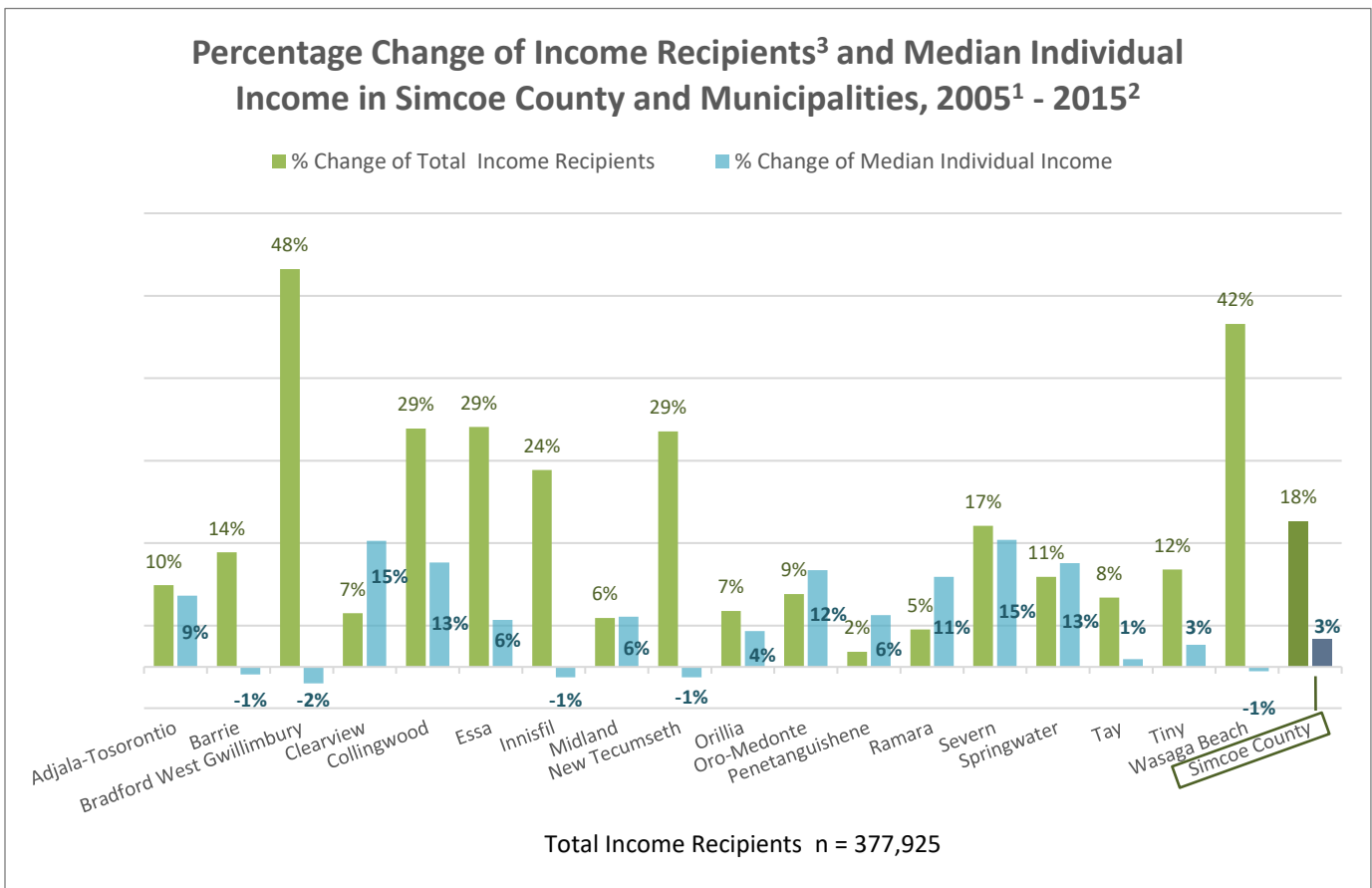

Municipalities in Simcoe County

The chart below provides an overview of the percentage change of total income recipients and median individual income in the Simcoe County Census Division and Municipalities (Census Subdivisions) from 2005 to 2015. The total income recipients account by a number of individuals, aged 15 years old and over in private households, which receipt individual income from certain sources, before income taxes and deductions.

All municipalities in Simcoe County demonstrated growth for a number of total income recipients over the past decade. Bradford West Gwillimbury (+ 48.2%) and Wasaga Beach (+ 41.6%) had the highest growth in the number of total income recipients in private households in Simcoe County over the past decade. Severn (+ 15.4%) and Clearview (+ 15.3%) had the highest growth in median total income among recipients from 2005¹ to 2015.

Economic Family Income^{viii}

Simcoe County

The following table shows the number of economic families and median income by economic family type in Simcoe County in 2015. Economic family, a group of two or more persons who live in the same dwelling and are related to each other by blood, marriage, common-law, or a foster relationship.

In Simcoe County, the number of economic families was 137,875 in 2015. The median total income for economic families was \$89,613. Three family members was an average family size in 2015.

- In Simcoe County, 43.4% of economic families (59,830) were couples with children, with the median total income of \$114,750 in 2015 – the highest median income among all economic family types.
- In Simcoe County, 38.6% of economic families (53,225) were couples without children or other relatives, with the median total income of \$78,685 in 2015.
- In Simcoe County, 15.2% of economic families (20,955) were lone-parent economic families, with the median total income of \$54,274 in 2015.

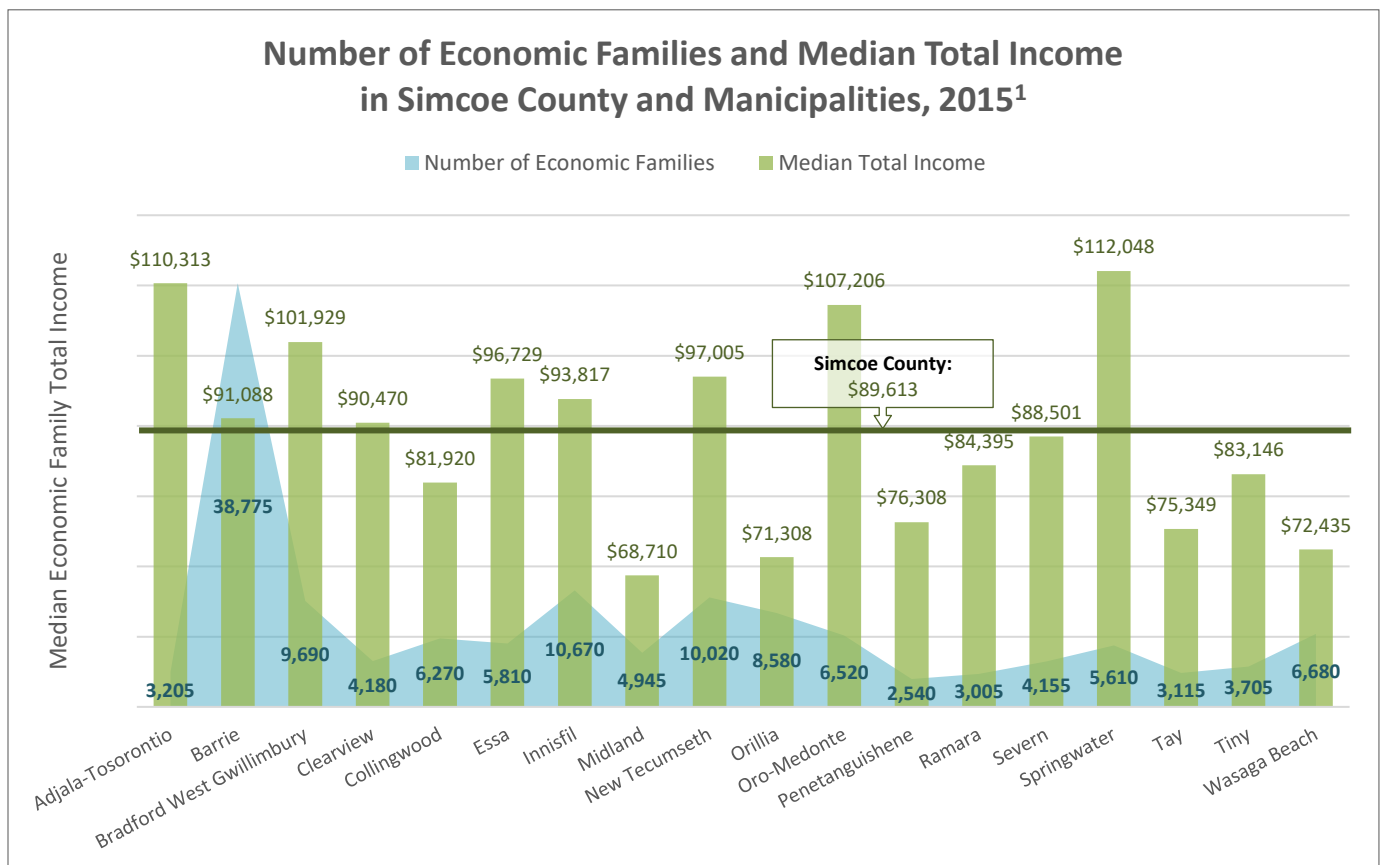

Municipalities in Simcoe County

The chart below provides an overview of the number of economic families and median economic family income for the Simcoe County Census Division and Municipalities (Census Subdivisions) in 2015.

In 2015, the range of median total income for economic families varied greatly among municipalities across Simcoe County. In 2015, Springwater (\$112,048) and Adjala-Tosorontio (\$110,313) had the highest median total income for economic families. Midland (\$68,710) and Orillia (\$71,308) had the lowest median total income among the municipalities in Simcoe County.

Low-Income^x

Simcoe County

The table below shows individuals in low-income status in Simcoe County using the After-Tax Low-Income Measure (LIM-AT). The concept underlying the LIM-AT is that a household identified as low-income if its income is less than half of the median income of all households. The low-income rate in Simcoe County slightly increased over the past decade, from 9.8% in 2005 to 11.4% in 2015.

In Simcoe County, there were 53,580 individuals lived in low-income households in 2015. The population of children aged 5 years and younger who were living in low-income households rose sharply from 3,310 in 2005 to 4,715 in 2015 (+ 42.4%). The population of Simcoe County residents aged 65 years old and over who were living in low-income households rose significantly, from 3,970 in 2005 to 7,800 in 2015 (+ 96.5%).

In Simcoe County, the prevalence of low-income for children was significantly higher than for the older age group. In 2015, nearly 14,290, or 15.0% of children aged 17 years old and younger lived in a low-income household, compared with 7,800 of senior adults aged 65 years and over (9.6%).

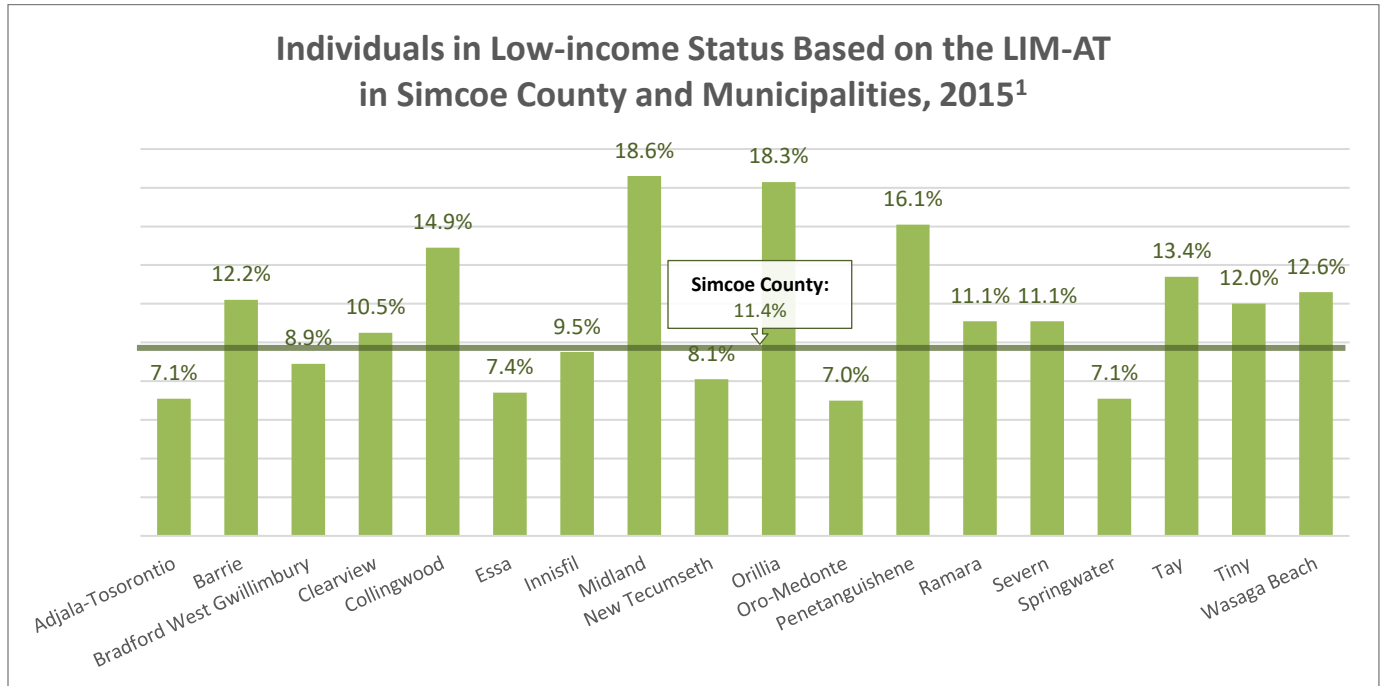

Glossary

ⁱ **Households** - Refers to a person or group of persons who occupy the same dwelling and do not have a usual place of residence elsewhere in Canada or abroad.

ⁱⁱ **Household total income** - In the context of households, total income refers to receipts from certain sources of all household members, before income taxes and deductions, during a specified reference period.

ⁱⁱⁱ **After-tax income** - Refers to total income less income taxes of the statistical unit during a specified reference period. Income taxes refers to the sum of federal income taxes, provincial and territorial income taxes, less abatement where applicable. Provincial and territorial income taxes include health care premiums in certain jurisdictions.

^{iv} **Individual Total Income** - In the context of persons, total income refers to receipts from certain sources, before income taxes and deductions, during a specified reference period.

^v **Market income** - The sum of employment income (wages, salaries and commissions, net self-employment income from farm or non-farm unincorporated business and/or professional practice), investment income, private retirement income (retirement pensions, superannuation and annuities, including those from registered retirement savings plans [RRSPs] and registered retirement income funds [RRIFs]) and other money income from market sources during the reference period..

^{vi} **Employment income** - Person with employment income during the reference period. Employment income can be in the form of wages, salaries and commissions or net self-employment income. All income received as wages, salaries and commissions from paid employment and net self-employment income from farm or non-farm unincorporated business and/or professional practice during the reference period.

^{vii} **Government transfers** - All cash benefits received from federal, provincial, territorial or municipal governments during the reference period. It includes:

- Old Age Security pension, Guaranteed Income Supplement, Allowance or Allowance for the Survivor;
- Retirement, disability and survivor benefits from Canada Pension Plan and Québec Pension Plan;
- Benefits from Employment Insurance and Québec parental insurance plan;
- Child benefits from federal and provincial programs;
- Social assistance benefits;
- Workers' compensation benefits;
- Working income tax benefit;
- Goods and services tax credit and harmonized sales tax credit;
- Other income from government sources.

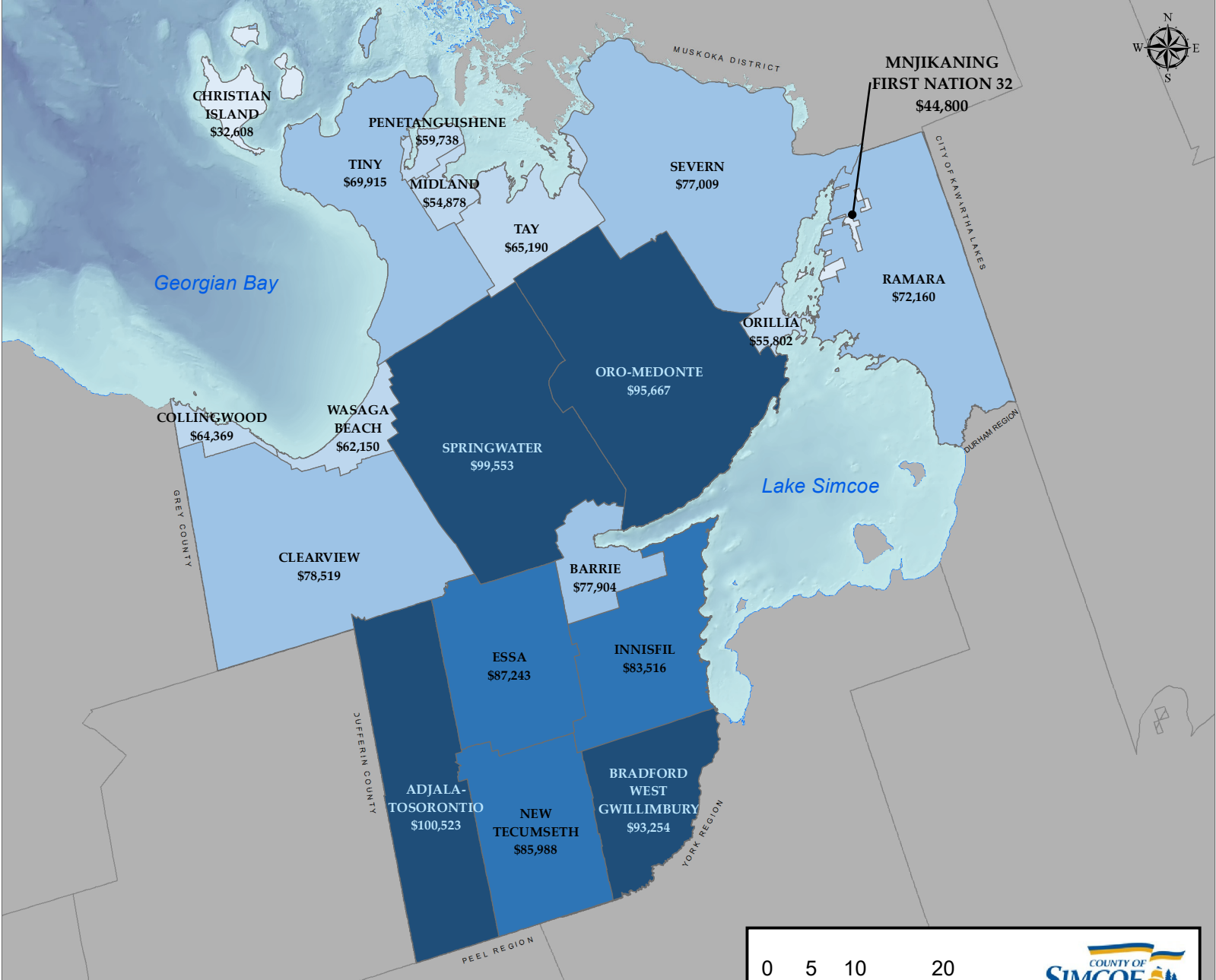
^{viii} **Economic family** - Refers to a group of two or more persons who live in the same dwelling and are related to each other by blood, marriage, common-law, or a foster relationship. A broader definition of family than the census family concept.

^{ix} **Economic family income** - In the context of economic families, total income refers to receipts from certain sources of all of its family members, before income taxes and deductions, during a specified reference period.

^x **The Low-Income Measure, After-Tax (LIM-AT)** - Refers to a fixed percentage (50%) of median adjusted after tax income of private households. The household after tax income is adjusted for house size by an equivalence scale to take economics of scale into account. Using data from the 2016 Census of Population, the line applicable to a household is defined as half the Canadian median of the adjusted household after-tax income multiplied by the square root of household size. The median is determined based on all persons in private households where low-income concepts are applicable.

^{xi} **Low-income** - Refers to the income situation of the statistical unit in relation to a specific low-income line in a reference year. Statistical units with income that is below the low-income line are considered to be in low-income. The low-income line referenced throughout this backgrounder in the Low-income Measure, After-Tax (LIM-AT), as it is the statistic used most frequently and as a key indicator by Statistics Canada. The low-income concepts are not applied in the territories and in certain areas based on census subdivision type (such as Indian reserves). The existence of substantial in-kind transfers (such as subsidized housing and First Nations band housing) and sizeable barter economies or consumption from own production (such as product from hunting, farming or fishing) could make the interpretation of low-income statistics more difficult in these situations.

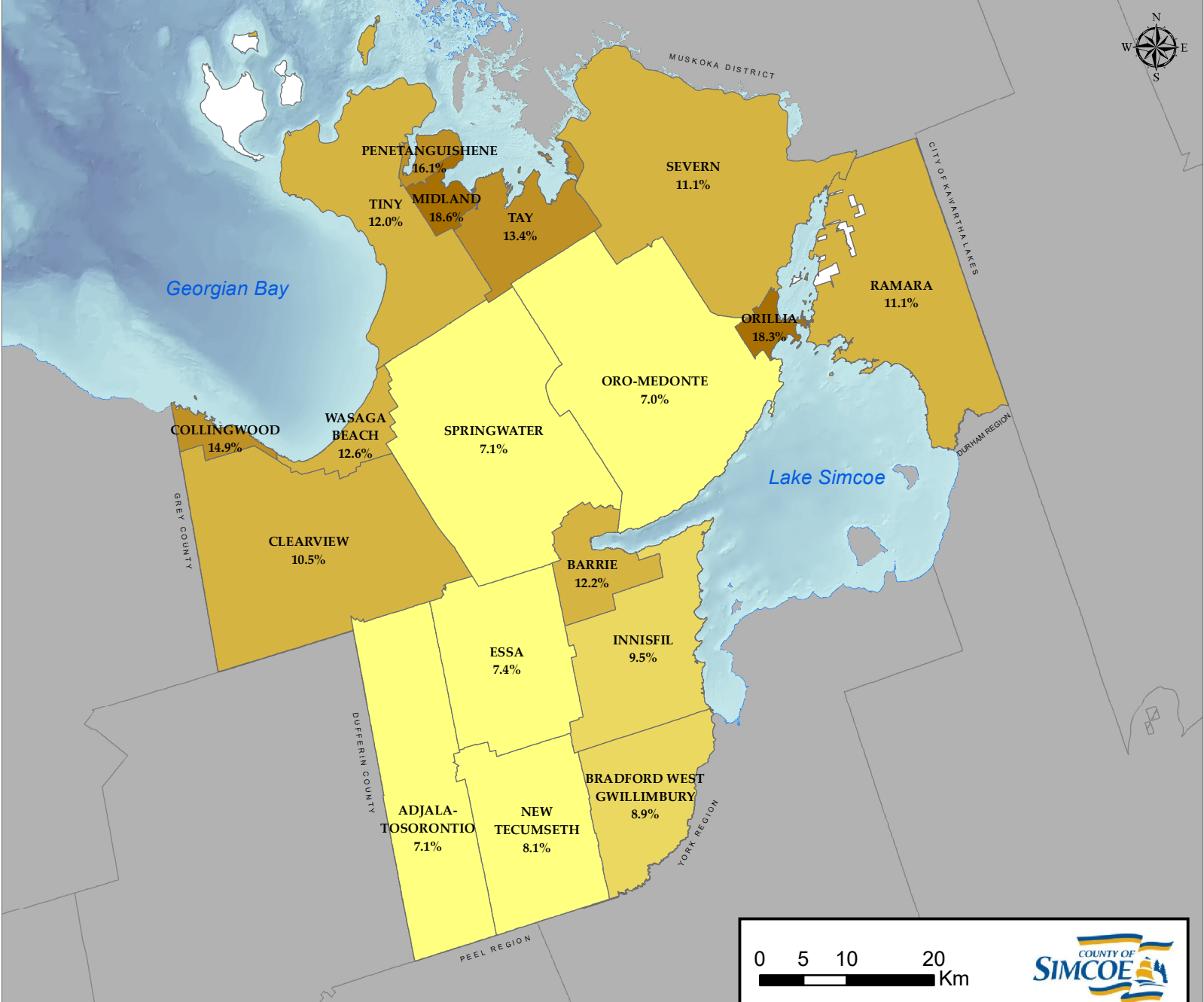

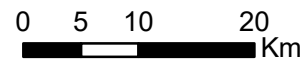

Low-income measure, after tax (LIM-AT) - The Low-income measure, after tax, refers to a fixed percentage (50%) of median-adjusted after-tax income of private households.

Low-income status - The income situation of the statistical unit in relation to a specific low-income line in a reference year. Statistical units with income that is below the low-income line are considered to be in low income.

Prevalence of low income - The proportion or percentage of units whose income falls below a specified low-income line.
