

Simcoe County 2021 Census Data Marital Status, Households and Families

Introduction

In Canada, the Census of Population (Census) is carried out every 5 years. The Census provides detailed information about the population and dwellings/households in Canada. The 2021 Census day was May 11th and provides an accurate snapshot of Canada's society at that point in time.

Small changes are made to the Census every cycle. Updates to the 2021 Census included a new question on Canadian military experience; a modified question on sex at birth and a new question on gender; updates to ethnic or cultural origins; new labour questions addressing underemployment; updated terminology related to Indigenous peoples; and new questions on membership within a Métis organization or Settlement, and enrollment under an Inuit land claims agreement (Statistics Canada, 2022).

The short form Census is completed by 100% of households and the long form is completed by 25% of households. The long form gathers additional detail, which is later mathematically applied to represent the whole population. Where possible, information is pulled from administrative databases such as personal income tax and benefit data from the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) and immigration information from Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC). The purpose of obtaining data from administrative sources is to reduce response burden and increase data quality.

The 2021 Census methodology and data was impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Topics likely impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic include information on employment, education, commuting and expenditures. Additional information about COVID-19 impacts on the Census can be found on the <u>Statistics Canada website</u> (Statistics Canada, 2022).





The response rate for the 2021 Census nationally was 98.0%. In 2021, 84.1% of Census forms were submitted online, up from 68.3% in 2016.

Statistics Canada uses a method called random rounding to ensure confidentiality. This means the values, including totals released are randomly rounded either up or down to a multiple of '5' or '10'. As a result, when these data are summed or grouped, the total value may not match the individual values since totals and sub-totals are independently rounded. Similarly, percentages, which are calculated on rounded data, may not necessarily add up to 100%.

The data presented in this report includes information for those residing in private dwellings and information from the short form questionnaire. Private dwelling refers to a separate set of living quarters with a private entrance either from outside the building or from a common hall, lobby, vestibule or stairway inside the building. The entrance to the dwelling must be one that can be used without passing through the living quarters of some other person or group of persons. This excludes those living in collective dwellings such as nursing homes, hospitals, etc.

Throughout this report gender refers to an individual's personal and social identity as a man, woman or non-binary person (a person who is not exclusively a man or a woman). Given that the non-binary population is small, individuals in the category "non-binary persons" were distributed into the other two gender categories and are denoted by the "+" symbol. Currently, data broken down by gender beyond Men+ and Women+ is not available for the Simcoe County census division.





Summary

- In Simcoe County in 2021, 59.4% of the population 15 years of age and older were married or common-law and 40.6% were not married and not living common-law.
 - a larger percentage of Women+ were widowed (8.8% vs 2.7%), divorced (7.3% vs 5.1%) or separated (3.5% vs 2.8%) compared to Men+, while a larger percentage of Men+ were never married (28.7% vs 22.1%) compared to Women+.
- In 2021, the percentage of private occupied dwellings which were occupied by one-census family households without additional persons decreased by over 5% compared to 2016 (64.0% vs 71.6%). New household types emerged in the Census Profile such as multigenerational households (4.2%) and one-census-family households with additional persons (4.1%). These additional categories show a shift from traditional household types.
 - Christian Island 30 had the largest percentage of one-census-family households with additional persons (6.8%), followed by Barrie (5.2%) and Bradford West Gwillimbury (4.7%).
- The average size of census families in 2016 and 2021 was 2.9.
 - Christian Island 30 had the largest percentage of census families with 5 or more persons (21.2%) followed by Bradford West Gwillimbury (11.6%) and Essa (9.6%).
- Of census family households, 67.4% were married couples, 16.5% were common-law couples and 16.1% were one-parent families. The percentage of common-law couples increased from 15.2% in 2016 to 16.5% in 2021.
- The largest percentage of persons in private households in 2021 were persons in census families (84.7%) and 15.3% were persons not in census families.
 - o More Women+ were parents in one-person families (7.2%) compared to Men+ (2.3%).
 - Collingwood had the largest percentage of persons living alone (15.7%) followed by Orillia (14.8%) and Midland (14.1%).



Marital Status of Population 15 Years of Age and Over

In Simcoe County in 2021, 83.7% of the population was 15 years of age or older. Marital status applies to the population 15 years of age and older. In Simcoe County in 2021, 59.4% of the population were married or common-law and 40.6% were not married and not living common-law. These numbers have not varied much compared to 2016. Looking at those not married and not living common-law in 2021, a larger percentage of Women+ were widowed, divorced or separated while a larger percentage of Men+ were never married.

Marital status varied by local municipality. Christian Island 30 had the largest percentage of the population 15 years of age and older not married or common-law (60.6%), followed by Orillia (48.8%) and Chippewas of Rama First Nation (47.6%).

Household Type

Census family is a type of family defined by Statistics Canada as 'a married couple and the children, if any, of either and/or both spouses; a couple living common law and the children, if any, of either and/or both partners; or a parent of any marital status in a one-parent family with at least one child living in the same dwelling as that child or those children. All members of a particular census family live in the same dwelling. Children may be biological or adopted children regardless of their age or marital status as long as they live in the dwelling and do not have their own married spouse, common-law partner or child living in the dwelling. Grandchildren living with their grandparent(s) but with no parents present also constitute a census family' (Statistics Canada). In 2021, the percentage of private occupied dwellings which were occupied by one-census family households without additional persons decreased by over 5% compared to 2016 (64.0% vs 71.6%). New household types emerged in the Census Profile such as multigenerational households⁴ and one-census-family households with additional persons⁵. These additional categories show a shift from traditional household types.

⁴ **Multigenerational households** represent all households where there is at least one person who is both the grandparent of a person in the household and the parent of another person in the same household. They also represent all households where there is at least one person who is both the child of a person in the household and the grandchild of another person in the same household. In previous Censuses, multigenerational households were only created based on the former definition, not the latter. As a result, there may be small differences in counts for 2011 and 2016 in archived tables.

Consolidated household type varied by local municipality. Christian Island 30 had the largest percentage of multigenerational households (9.1%), followed by Bradford West Gwillimbury (7.5%) and Chippewas of Rama First Nation (6.6%). Christian Island 30 also had the largest percentage of one-census-family households with additional persons (6.8%), followed by Barrie (5.2%) and Bradford West Gwillimbury (4.7%).

Census Family Size

The total number of census families in Simcoe County in 2021 was 155,150. The number of census families is more than the sum of census family household types as some categories represent more than one census family. Little difference was seen in family size in Simcoe County between 2016 and 2021.

Census Family Household Type

In Simcoe County in 2021, 83.9% of census families in private households were couple families and 16.1% were one-parent families. The percentage of couple families who were common-law couples increased from 15.2% in 2016 to 16.5% in 2021.

Census family household type varied by local municipality. Chippewas of Rama First Nation had the largest percentage of common-law couples (30.0%), following by Christian Island 30 (24.2%) and Tiny (21.5%). Christian Island 30 had the largest percentage of one-parent families (39.4%) followed by Chippewas of Rama First Nation (26.7%) and Orillia (22.7%).
