n behalf of the County of Simcoe, I want to thank all residents for doing your part to make our first full calendar year under our new automated cart collection system a success. Change can undoubtedly be difficult, and there was some initial apprehension and evolution, but we are together seeing the tremendous benefits of the new cart system and our modified collection schedule: the overwhelming majority of residents appear to be very happy with their new carts and the program. The change also immediately addressed industry-wide labour shortages by moving from manual collection to an automated system, and by adjusting to a four-day collection schedule, we have brought further consistency to your collections. Most importantly, we hope you are enjoying the added convenience of the cart system in your household.

In June 2022, we conducted a survey and received more than 5,500 responses, which showed that 88 per cent of our survey participants are either satisfied or very satisfied with the new cart system. We are also pleased that those of you who may prefer smaller carts will continue to have an opportunity to exchange your carts for a size that fits your household needs

The County also received great news about our progress on waste diversion – a testament to our residents' ongoing commitment to the environment. This news also highlights the leadership of County Council and our waste management staff, who continue to support and implement innovative diversion programs. The County ranked second amona 98 municipalities in Ontario for its diversion rate We diverted 64 per cent of residential waste produced from disposal. Though there is always room for improvement, these results show how the County is continuing its 15-year success streak and leading the way on diversion in Ontario.

In 2023, we look forward to continuing to improve on our waste management services and waste diversion results, while we work on planning and implementing strategies to deal with the future waste

management needs of our growing region.

Thank you again for your efforts and support towards our ongoing commitment to reducing our waste footprint in Simcoe County. Together as a community, we will prosper by working towards a more sustainable future for all

### **BI-WEEKLY RECYCLING**

- » Check below to confirm if packaging is recyclable or visit simcoe.cg/wastewizard
- » Remove all food residue and place recyclables loose inside the cart, do NOT bag (exception shredded paper).

#### CARDBOARD FLATTEN\* & BOXBOARD

Flatten cardboard and put inside the recycling cart. \* If quantities are larger, flatten and bundle (max.75x75x20cm) beside cart.



- If you were weighed in, you must be weighed out. Not returning over the scale may incur a significant charge, making you ineligible for service until the charge is paid.

# CHRISTMAS TREE & WINTER COLLECTION TIPS

### WINTER COLLECTION TIPS

- Place waste in a visible location at the end of your driveway, not on or behind a snowbank. If necessary, clear a small area.
- To prevent material from freezing and sticking, line your organic cart with newspaper.
- equipment, it is the resident's responsibility to clean up the materials and, if required, contact Service Simcoe to arrange repairs or replacement of damaged cart(s).
- Inclement weather or poor road conditions may result in the cancellation of collection services.
- Download the Simcoe County Collects mobile app to receive alerts specific to collection impacts in your area.

# CHRISTMAS TREE COLLECTION

- Remove plastic tree bags, decorations, and stands. Trees must be out to the curb by 7 a.m. on Monday of your collection week. See map on page 6, to determine zone. Christmas tree collection will occur during the week, not necessarily on your regular waste collection day.
- The **maximum size is 2m**; if longer, cut into smaller sections.
- To ensure collection, trees must be clearly visible and not frozen into snowbanks, on a cleared driveway or ~1m x 1m pad. Collection crews will not climb snowbanks to retrieve or dig out trees. Don't place Christmas trees on road or sidewalk.

IN GROCERY BILLS BY FOLLOWING THESE TIPS:

### **PLAN**

- Before shopping, do an inventory of what you have to avoid duplication.
- Try to use what you have before buying more.
- Plan meals, focus on what you need at the grocery store, and avoid impulse buying.

### **SHOP WISELY**

- Avoid shopping when hungry.
- · Buying in bulk doesn't save money if you throw away food that's not eaten. Buy only as much as you need.
- Be realistic, not optimistic. Shop for what you will actually eat.

### **STORE PROPERLY**

- · The freezer is your friend. Whether it's herbs. bread or meat. it can all be frozen
- · Save leftovers and actually eat them. Freeze those that can't be consumed promptly. Label the container with the date and contents.
- · Try using an 'eat first' bin in the refrigerator for foods that should be consumed soon to avoid wastage.



Waste audits show the average household in the County throws away 99 kg of edible food waste annually.



### HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE



See page 2 for facilities where residential Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) materials can be disposed of safely and free of charge.

Ensure containers are clearly labelled, secured, and leak-proof. Never combine products and keep HHW materials separate from other materials in your load, as explosive or poisonous chemical reactions may occur.

#### **Acceptable Materials**

- · Paints and stains
- · Oil, transmission, and antifreeze fluids
- Batteries
- Fire extinguishers
- · Oil filters and containers
- Fluorescent bulbs and tubes
- Gasoline (containers cannot be returned)
- Solvents and household cleaners
- · Swimming pool chemicals
- Mercury thermostats
- · Pesticides (fungicides, herbicides, insecticides)
- Fertilizers
- Propane tanks and cylinders (max. 100lb)
- Needles and syringes (in approved containers)

#### **Unacceptable Materials**

- Explosives (spent fireworks, flares, ammunition, and gun powder)
- · Smoke and carbon monoxide detectors, etc.
- Pharmaceuticals and medications
- · Visit **healthsteward.ca** for free disposal options

Place material out for collection by **7 a.m. on Monday** of your collection week. Collection will occur during the week, **not necessarily on your regular collection day.** 

Use kraft paper yard waste bags, compostable bags, cardboard boxes, or open-ended rigid containers for your yard waste.



Bundle with string, maximum 2 m long and 30 cm in diameter

- Leaves
- Grass
- · Garden waste
- Decorative cornstalks and straw bales
- Brush

#### **Unacceptable Materials**

- Pet waste
- Lumber

- Shoes, socks and mittens in pairs (wrap with elastic to hold together)

#### Help us keep electronic waste out of the landfill.

Delete all personal data and place bags and larger loose items out at the curb.


#### **Acceptable Materials**

- · Computers, printers, televisions, and monitors
- · Cellular phones, video gaming consoles
- Small appliances (toasters, kettles, electric mixers, etc.)
- Personal care (hair dryers, electric shavers, etc.)
- · Cords and small corded power tools

#### **Unacceptable Materials**

- Packing material and boxes
- Disk/games, batteries, and toys
- Coffee pots, lightbulbs and large appliances

Place extra material into clear bags for collection. Sealed bags must be out on your regular collection day at 7 a.m. of your specific week, regardless of what time your regular waste is collected. The County reserves the right to refuse collection if improperly set-out or over-weight (20 kg).



Your textile and electronics week may have changed to improve routing efficiencies. Please refer to **simcoe.ca/waste** or the **Simcoe County Collects app** to determine clothing and electronics collection dates.

### **WASTE FACILITY TIPS**








Brush disposal fee of \$75/tonne covers the cost of processing into brush chips which are available free of charge.

- Busy times are on **Saturdays** and early in the week; avoid these days if possible.
- ₹
- Material not properly sorted into the designated diversion areas cause your entire load to be charged at the mixed-waste rate of \$310/ tonne.
- Separate materials in your load. Divertible materials may be free or qualify for a reduced fee (see page 2 for more information).
- Insulation and Styrofoam packaging must be bagged to reduce windblown litter.
- There is a minimum fee of \$10 for disposal; avoid coming to the facility with small loads.
- Propane cylinders are accepted free of charge but please do not put them in the garbage or recycling. Notify site staff upon arrival at the facility as they are managed differently for health and safety reasons.
- Vehicles must enter the scale on a green light and declare the type of waste.
- Due to health and safety policies, staff can not assist with the lifting or removal of waste from vehicles.
- **Prior to leaving** the site, vehicles **must return to the scale**. The computerized weigh scale system calculates waste disposal charges.
- **Payment** is due prior to leaving the site.

When packing lunches, use reusable water bottles and food containers to reduce waste and avoid pre-packaged snacks as their packaging is not usually recyclable.





### BATTERY COLLECTION WEEK

PLACE YOUR BAG ON TOP OF YOUR CART



1. Collect dry cell, single-use, AA, AAA, C, D, 9-Volt and button batteries

(No rechargeable NiCad, NiMN, Lithium Ion, car batteries, battery packs or industrial batteries).

- 2. Place acceptable batteries into the battery bag and seal using the zip tab.
- 3. Place bag on top of your cart. Have curbside by 7 a.m.

2023 **Battery collection** 

will occur on your regular collection day during the

week of November 6.

#### **Acceptable Materials**

- · AA, AAA, C, D, and 9-Volt
- · Alkaline-manganese and carbon zinc
- · Zinc air dry cell batteries and button batteries



#### **Unacceptable Materials**

- · Rechargeable batteries such as: NiCad, NiMH, or Lithium Ion (cell phones, lap tops, etc.)

### CHANGE IS COMING TO THE RECYCLING PROGRAM

The Ontario government is implementing Producer Responsibility legislation that will make producers responsible for managing the waste generated from their packaging to promote innovation, reduce waste and lower costs for taxpayers. Producer Responsibility means the producers, companies that design, create and market products and packaging, will be responsible for managing and paying for the entire lifecycle of their packaging to make recycling more manageable and accessible across the province.

Producer Responsibility for the recycling program commences July 1, 2023, using a phased approach that will take two and a half years to complete. The County of Simcoe will transition in early 2024. The province has similar legislation in place already for the management of tires, some hazardous wastes and electronics. Municipalities may play a role, simply acting as a convenient collection point on behalf of producers; however, it's the Province that establishes requirements and the producers are ultimately responsible for managing materials.

#### What does this mean for you?

- County Council may opt to temporarily become a recycling collection service provider for producers until 2026. If this happens, eligible locations (residential properties with less than six units) shouldn't notice any change in recycling collection service. Regardless, the Province will continue to ensure that, during the transition to producer responsibility, there will be no disruption to public services for suitable locations.
- Starting in 2026, producers will be fully responsible for collecting and managing Blue Box recycling.
- The Blue Box program will become standardized across the program, making the same materials acceptable all across Ontario.
- More residential locations may become eligible to receive recycling collection service, including larger multiresidential buildings.
