Town of Innisfil Official Plan: I-OP-1801 – Public Service Facilities Policy Non-Decision AS MODIFIED - FINAL

- 23.1.16 Public service facilities are directed towards settlement areas and shall be permitted in any settlement area designation without amendment to this Plan. Public service facilities may be located outside of settlement areas in limited situations and in accordance with the following:
 - i) For clarity, all of the following criteria shall be demonstrated to the satisfaction of the Town and County if a **Public service facility** is proposed outside of a **settlement area**:
 - a. The proposed use is not appropriate inside a **settlement area**, or is required by a government body (i.e. municipal, provincial, or federal) to provide a service in a specific geographic area;
 - Alternative locations inside settlement areas have been evaluated and are not available or feasible;
 - c. Appropriate water and wastewater services are planned by the municipality or available to support the proposed use;
 - d. The proposed use shall be compatible and/or minimize any adverse impacts on the rural landscape and surrounding uses;
 - e. Traffic from **development** can be accommodated within the planned or existing transportation **infrastructure**;
 - f. Appropriate stormwater management opportunities are available with a focus on low impact development;
 - g. The proposed **development** site is not located within a specialty crop designation;
 - h. The proposed use will not be located in an area that may have a **negative impact** on the efficient and logical expansion of nearby **settlement areas**:
 - i. The proposed development site is not within a Key Natural Heritage Feature and/or Key Hydrologic Feature. If the site is on lands adjacent to a Key Natural Heritage Feature or Key Hydrologic Feature, the proposed development must demonstrate consistency with the Provincial Policy Statement, Growth Plan and Lake Simcoe Protection Plan, if applicable through a Natural Heritage Evaluation, and also subject to Policy 17.1 of this Plan and the Natural Heritage policies of the Simcoe County Official Plan;
 - If the proposed **development** site is within the County Greenlands, Policy 3.8, or equivalent, of the Simcoe County Official Plan shall apply.
 - ii) If such use is proposed within the Agricultural Area designation, a County and local Official Plan Amendment will be required, and the locational

criteria set out in Policy 23.1.16 (a-j) shall be required to be demonstrated to the satisfaction of the Town and County;

23.1.16.1 Public Service Facility – Hospital

- A hospital and complementary uses, due to unique operational needs and importance to both the Town of Innisfil and surrounding municipalities, are likely to be located outside of a **settlement area** in a campus style setting;
- ii) For the purposes of this section, any publicly funded hospital and complementary uses shall be considered a "Public service facility";
- iii) Locational considerations shall meet the criteria established by 23.1.16(i)(c-j), and all of policy 14.1.7(ii);
- iv) If such use is proposed within the Agricultural Area designation, a County and local Official Plan Amendment will be required;
- v) If such use is proposed within the Rural Area designation, a local Official Plan Amendment will be required.
