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Census 2016: Marital Status, Families and Households

Key Points

- The percent change of marital status categories that have grown the greatest in Simcoe County since the last census were living common law (+15.6%) and divorced (+14.8%).
- In Simcoe County, the number of census families in private households rose from 130,800 in 2011 to 140,900 in 2016. This is an increase of 10,100 census families or 7.7%.
- The percent change of family structure with the greatest growth in Simcoe County since the last census was common-law couples (+15.8%), followed by lone-parent families (+10.4%). Over the past five years the percent change of married couples (+5.5%) and couples with children (+4.4%) have slightly increased.
- More people were living alone in Simcoe County in 2016. The percent change of one-person household size has increased (+11.5%) over the past five years.

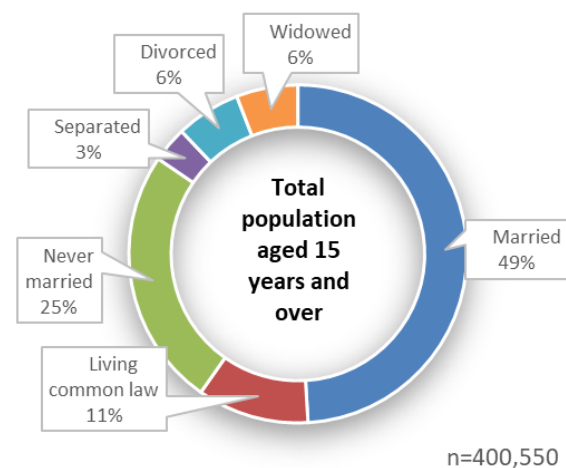
Note: Refers to the marital status of the person, taking into account his/her common-law status. Persons who are married or living common law may be of opposite sex or of the same sex.

From 2011 to 2016 in Simcoe County, marital status with the highest percent change include those living in common law (+15.6%) and divorced (+14.8%).

Of the total Simcoe County population 15 years of age and over, 49.1% were married, 24.8% were single (never legally married), and 10.7% were living with a common-law partner. The remaining 15.5% of the population were divorced (6.2%), widowed (5.9%), or separated (3.4%).

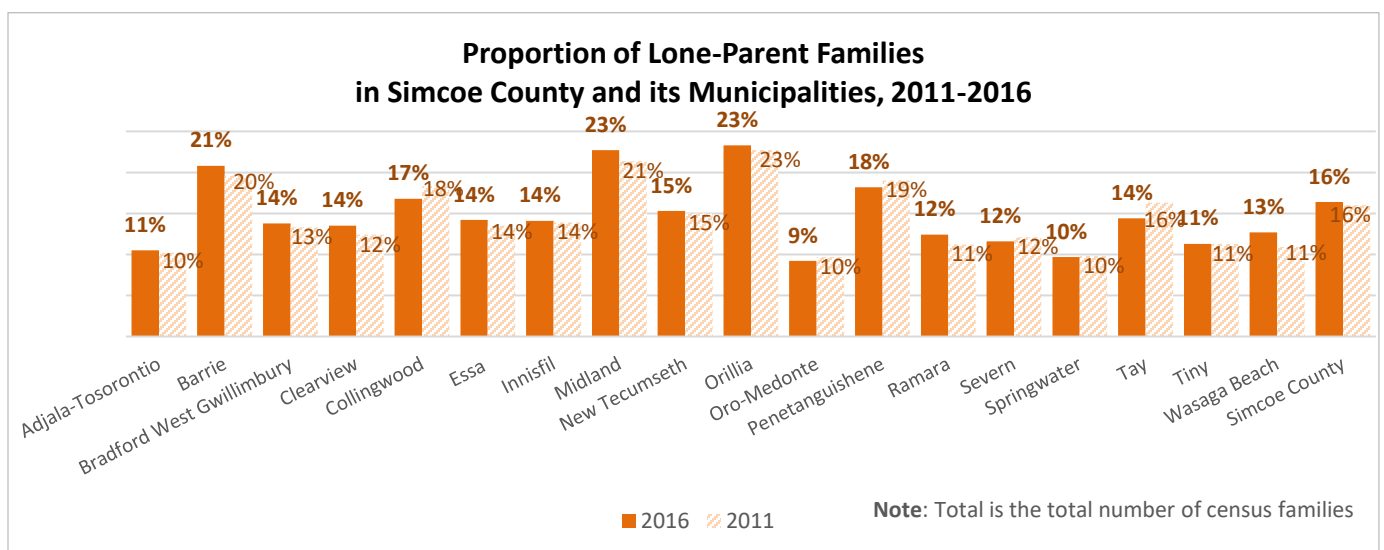

Family Structure

The table below shows the number, percent, and change from 2011 to 2016 of census families in private households by family structure for the Simcoe County Census Division.

Overall, there was an increase of 7.7% (10,100) in the number of census families in private households in Simcoe County. From 2011 to 2016, the structure of families remained approximately the same. However, the percent change of lone-parent families (10.4%) was slightly greater than the percent change of couple-families (7.2%).

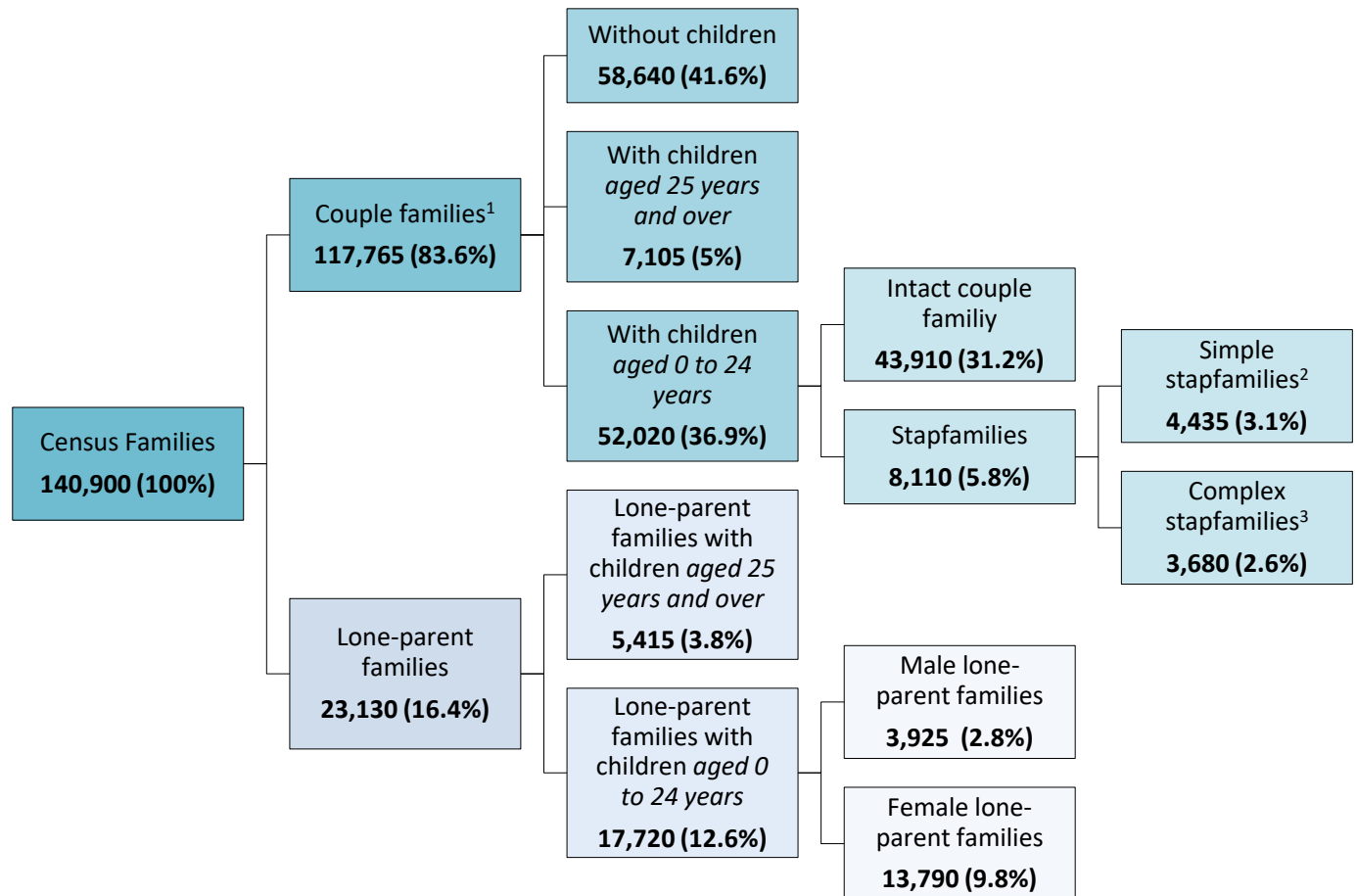

The chart below provides overview of census families with children in private households for the Simcoe County Census Division in 2016. In Simcoe County, 83.6% (117,765) of households were couple-families, while the remaining 16.4% (23,130) were lone-parent families.

Note:

- Couple family with children:** A census family that contains a married couple or a couple living common law and at least one child. A couple may be of opposite or same sex. Children may be children by birth, marriage, common-law union or adoption regardless of their age or marital status as long as they live in the dwelling and do not have their own spouse, partner or child living in the dwelling.
- Simple stepfamily:** A stepfamily in which all children are the biological or adopted children of one, and only one, married spouse or common-law partner, and whose birth or adoption preceded the current relationship.
- Complex stepfamily:** There are three type of complex stepfamilies. First, a couple family in which there is at least one child of both parents and at least one child of only one parent. Second, a couple family in which there is at least one child of each parent and not children of both parent. Third, a couple family in which there is at least one child of both parents and at least one child of each parent.

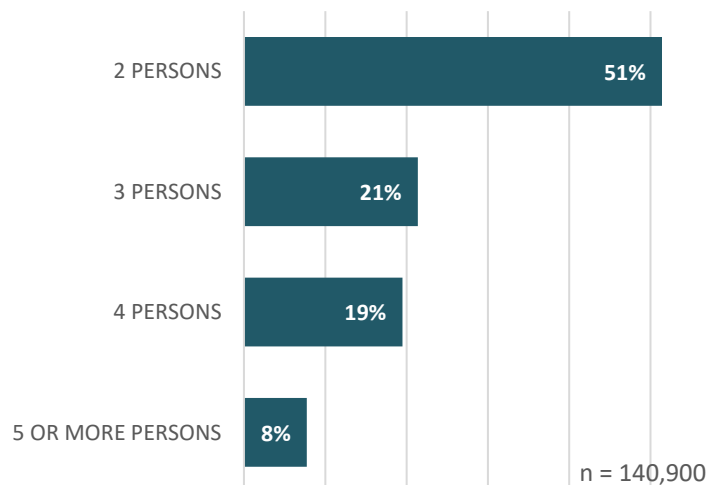

The chart on the left shows the percent of census families in private households by family size in Simcoe County in 2016. In Simcoe County, more than 50% of census families in private households were composed of two persons (51%). The remaining census families in private household were composed of 3 persons (21%), 4 persons (19%), and 5 or more persons (8%).

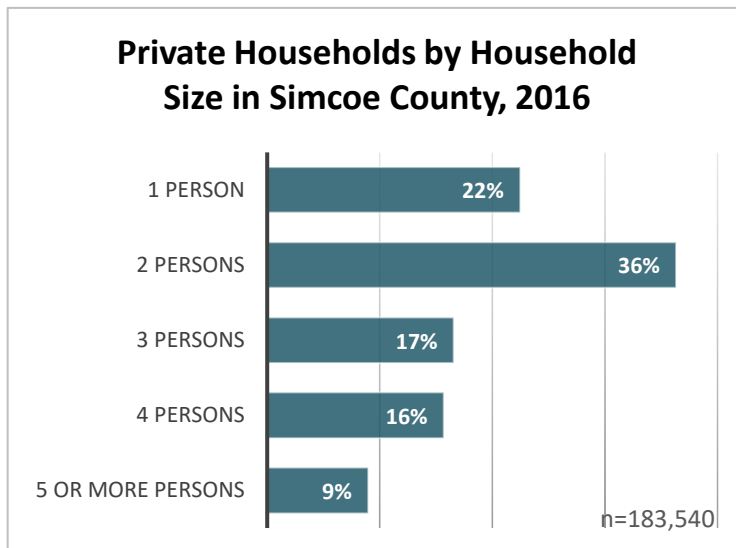

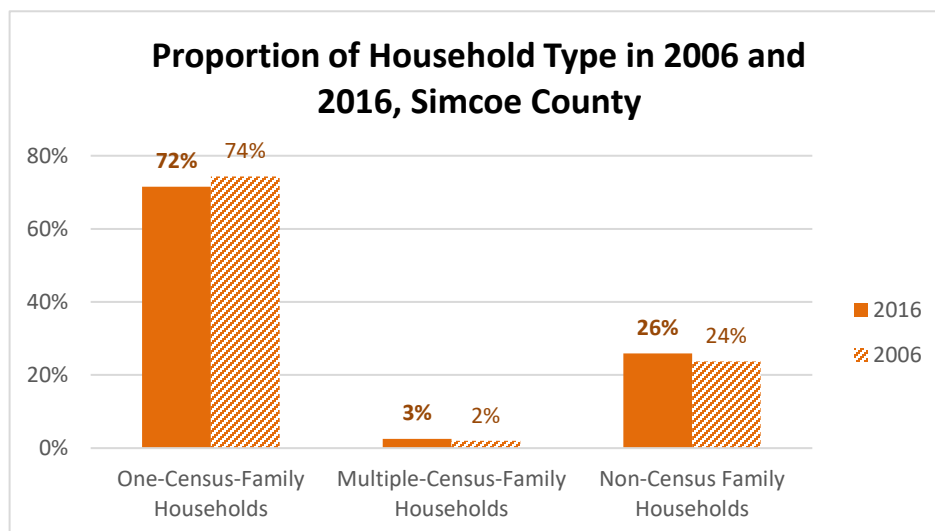

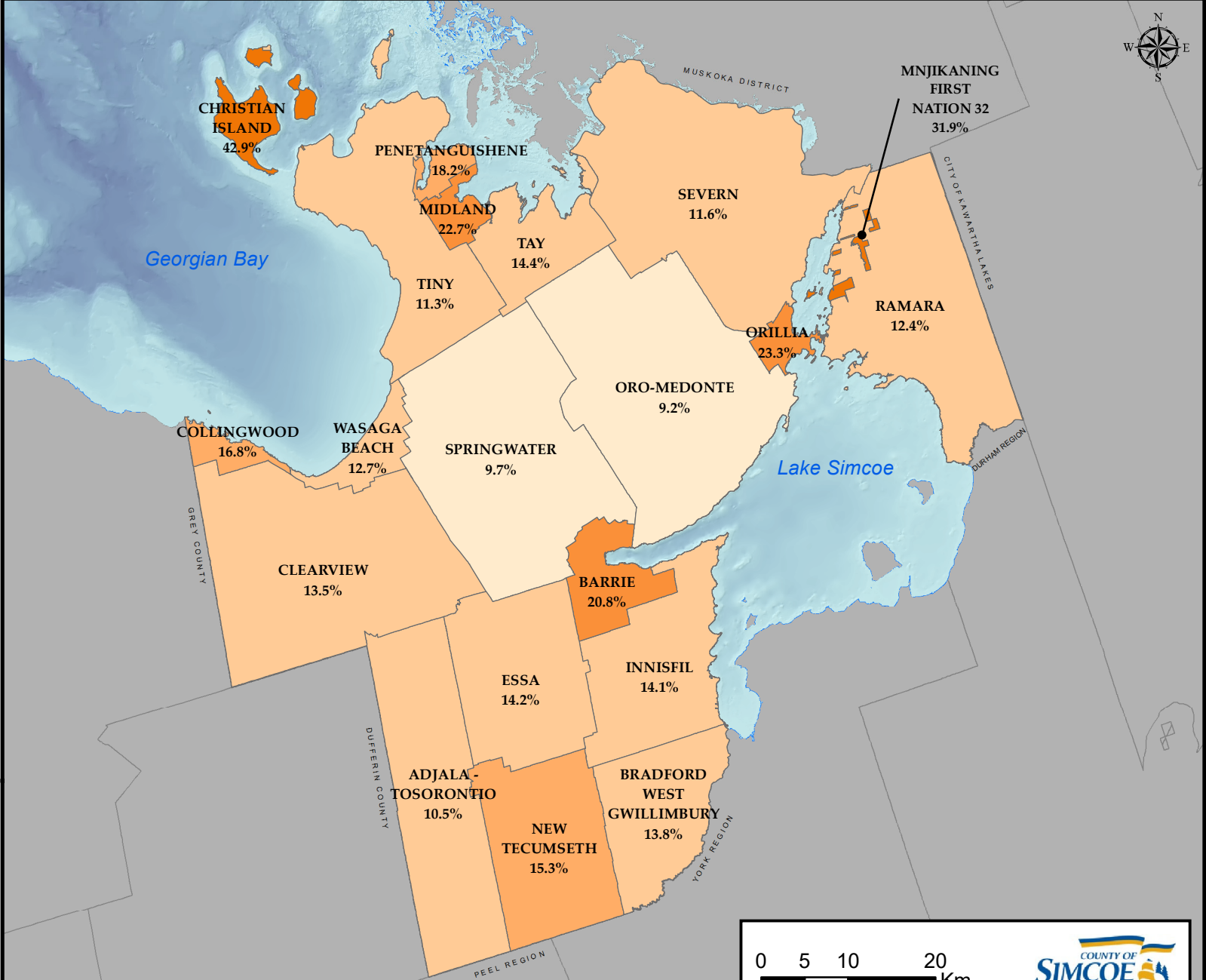

Glossary

ⁱ **Marital Status** refers to whether or not a person is living in a common-law union as well as the legal marital status of those who are not living in a common-law union. All persons aged less than 15 are considered as never married and not living common law.

ⁱⁱ **Census Family** is any of (1) a married couple and the children, if any, of either and/or both spouses; (2) a couple living common law and the children, if any, of either and/or both partners; or (3) a lone parent of any marital status with at least one child living in the same dwelling and that child or those children. All members of a particular census family live in the same dwelling. A couple may be of opposite or same sex. Children may be children by birth, marriage, common-law union or adoption regardless of their age or marital status as long as they live in the dwelling and do not have their own married spouse, common-law partner or child living in the dwelling. Grandchildren living with their grandparent(s) but with no parents present also constitute a census family.

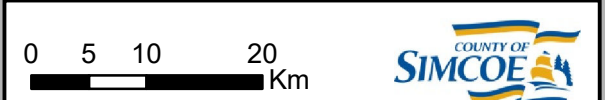
ⁱⁱⁱ **Household** refers to the division of living arrangements into census family and non-family households. **Family household** refers to a household that contains at least one census family. **One-family household** refers to a single census family (with or without other persons) that occupies a private dwelling. **Multiple-family household** refers to a household in which two or more census families (with or without additional persons) occupy the same private dwelling. Family households may also be divided based on the presence of persons not in a census family. **Non-family household** refers to either one person living alone in a private dwelling or to a group of two or more people who share a private dwelling, but who do not constitute a census family. **Multigenerational household** refers to a household with three or more generations. These households have at least one person who is the grandparent and the parent of someone in the household.



Proportion of Lone-Parent Families based on Total Families in Simcoe County and Municipalities, 2011-2016

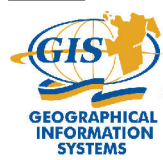
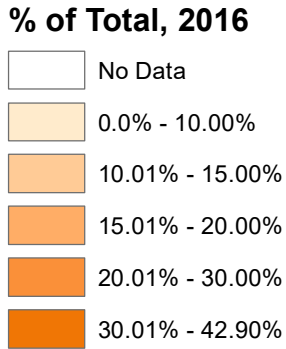
