- Canadian Community Economic Development Network (CCEDNET) is now the new host for the Community Data Program
- Transition is complete



Data Purchase and Access Working Group Meetings

- There was a meeting on April 18th, July 24th and September 23rd
 - Longitudinal Immigration Database tables (IMDB order)
 - County of Simcoe's LIP team provided their prioritizations of variables
 - T1FF tables at custom geographies
 - If this orders goes ahead, it would be a limited number of taxfiler tables produced at custom geographies
 - Household & Family-level Target Group Profiles
 - Statistics Canada has indicated that this table is proving difficult and complicated to verify and no delivery estimate has been provided yet
 - Modest income table
 - Working on it, can be used to look at modest income population as well as calculate depth of poverty


