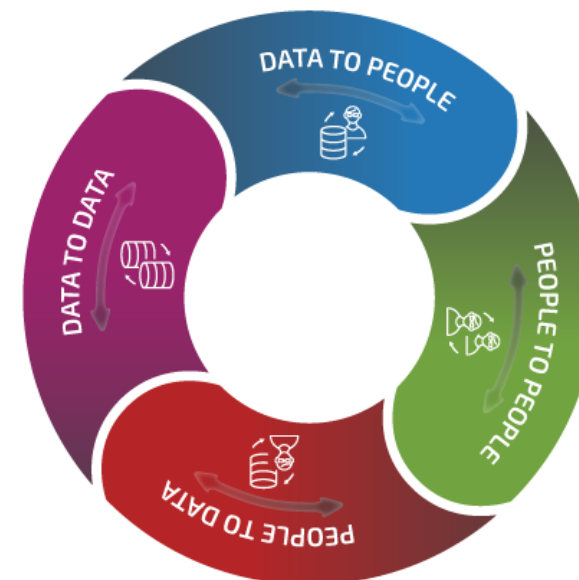

- *Using the same definition as the Metcalfe Foundation*
- *Expanded Selected characteristics dimension to include detailed Visible minority classifications*
- *Change age groupings to 18-24 instead of 15-24*
- *Added Working poor status dimension*

The Metcalf Foundation defines a member of the **working poor** as someone who:

- has an after-tax income below the Low-income measure (LIM),
- has earnings of at least \$3,000 a year,
- is between the ages of 18 and 64,
- is not a student, and
- lives independently.

CDP Updates

What is a Target Group Profile?



- Target group profiles (TGP) provide Census Profile variables for a subset, or target group, of the population.



Outputs:

- a) Profiles focusing on a target groups (Immigrants, Seniors 65+, Children 0-6 year old, etc.)
- b) Comparisons among different population groups (e.g. demographics of employed and unemployed people, characteristics of different age groups of population, etc.)
- c) Community snapshots, infographics, etc.

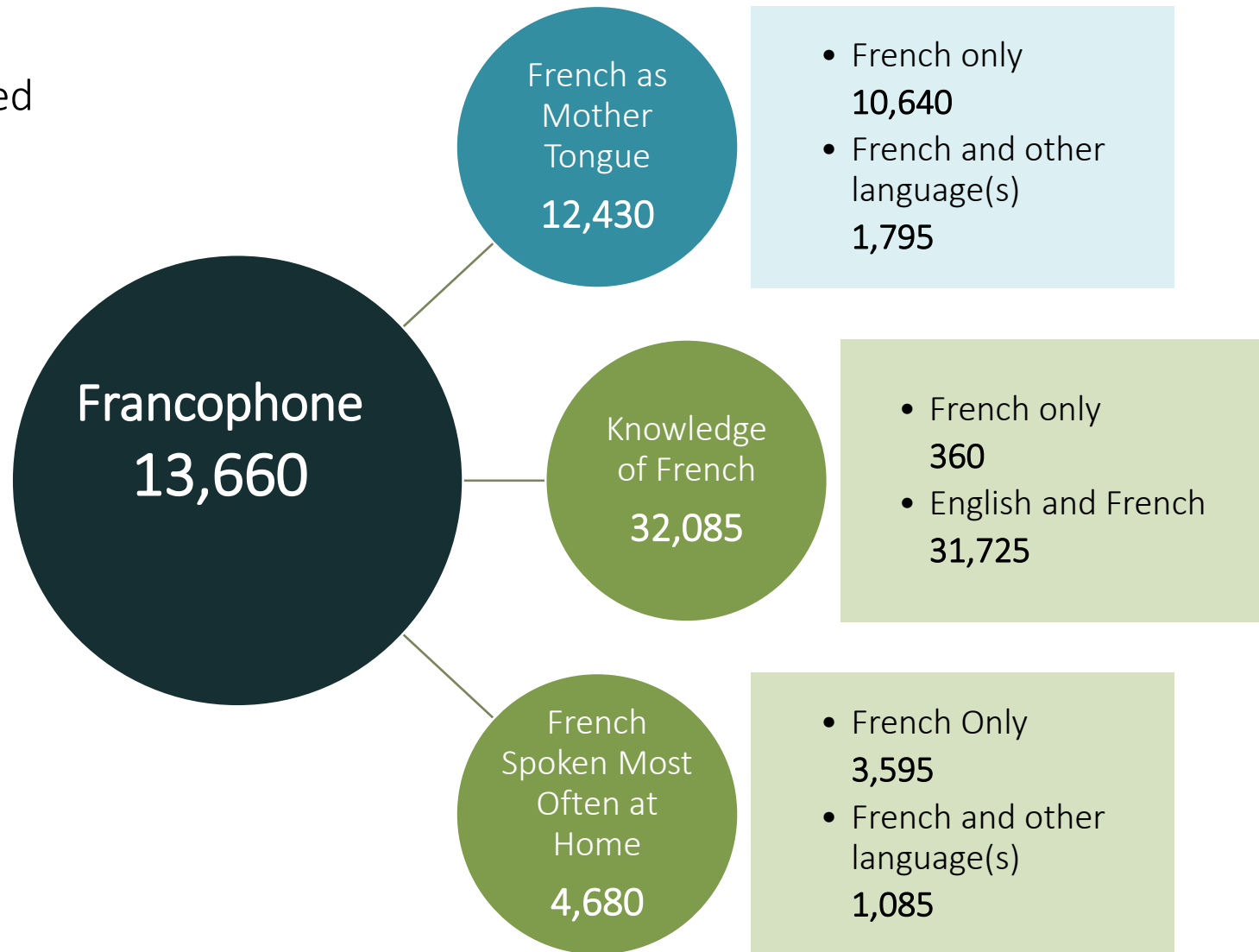


Francophone Population in Simcoe County, 2016



In 2009, the Ontario Office of Francophone Affairs introduced the Inclusive Definition of Francophone (IDF).

Under the new IDF definition, **Francophones** are “persons whose mother tongue is French, plus those whose mother tongue is neither French nor English but have a particular knowledge of French as an Official Language and use French at home.

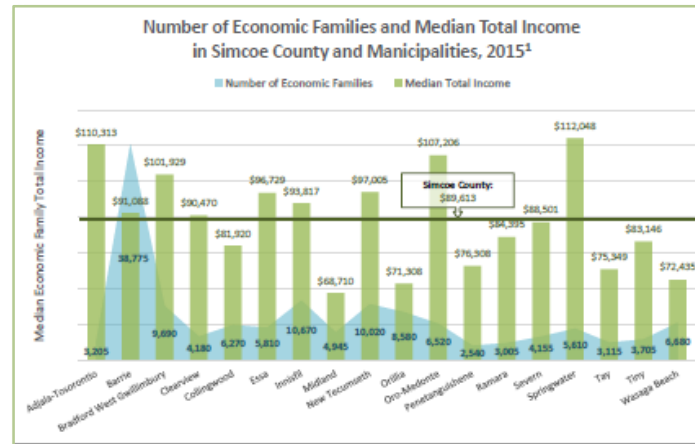

Statistics Canada is currently in the process of developing a consultation and testing strategy to determine the terminology that will be used when referring to these populations in the next census and in future surveys.

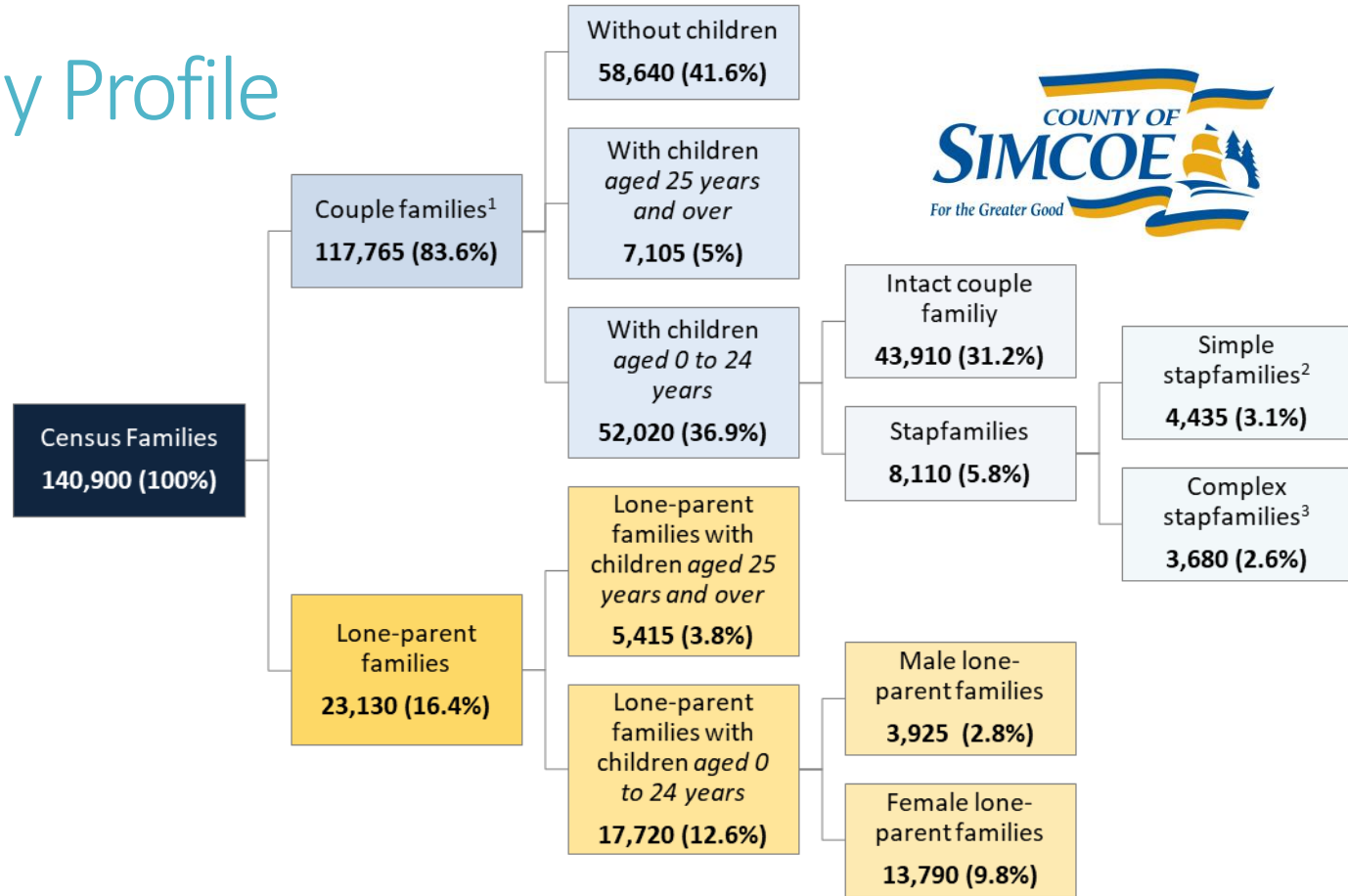

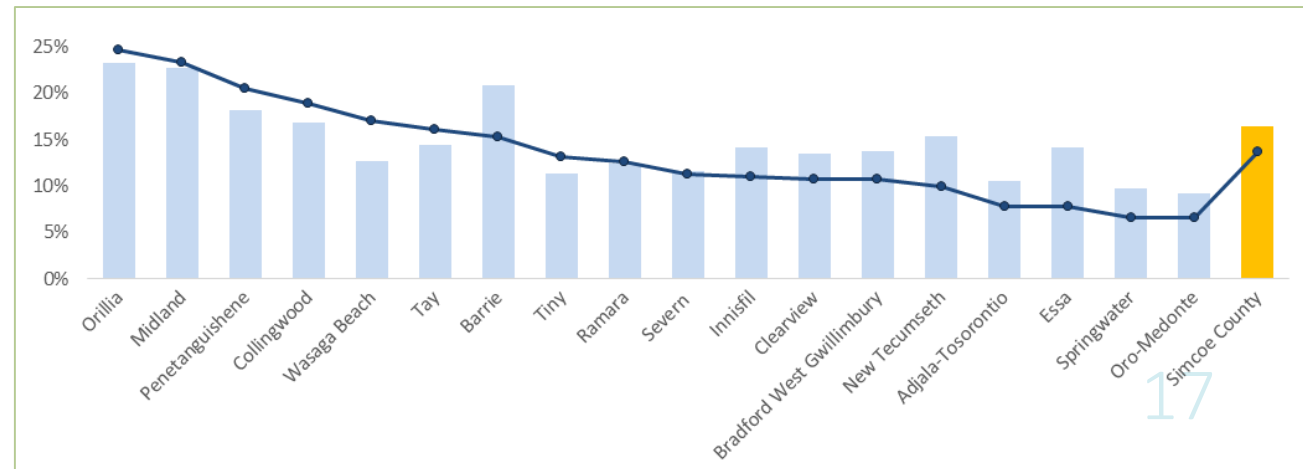
