### Table Specifications

- Working Poor
- Using the same definition as the Metcalfe Foundation
- Expanded Selected characteristics dimension to include detailed Visible minority classifications
- Change age groupings to 18-24 instead of 15-24
- Added Working poor status dimension





The Metcalf Foundation defines a member of the working poor as someone who:

- has an after-tax income below the Low-income measure (LIM),
- has earnings of at least \$3,000 a year,
- is between the ages of 18 and 64,
- is not a student, and
- lives independently.

## What is a Target Group Profile?

 Target group profiles (TGP) provide Census Profile variables for a subset, or target group, of the population.





## Outputs:

- a) Profiles focusing on a target groups (Immigrants, Seniors 65+, Children 0-6 year old, etc.)
- b) Comparisons among different population groups (e.g. demographics of employed and unemployed people, characteristics of different age groups of population, etc.)
- c) Community snapshots, infographics, etc.




















## 2016 Census Report:




