Simcoe	441115	41420	9.39%

- Between 2006 and 2011 there were 5575 new individuals who reported a Non-official mother tongue. This represents a 16% increase from 2006 to 2011 while the overall population rose by only 6%.
- The proportion of Non-Official mother tongues rose from 8.60% in 2006 to 9.39% in 2011
- Number of Unique Non-Official Languages reported:

2001: 58

2006: 66

2011: 107

Although we do not have any recent immigration data from the 2011 census, we can still gain a perspective of Simcoe Counties cultural landscape using the recently released language statistics.




Where in Simcoe County are the 41,420 respondents who indicated their mother tongue was a Non-Official Language?












German: Age for Simcoe County



While some languages may be more prominent, we also observe a declining population. One example, German, has shown a decrease across most of Simcoe County. We can understand this trend more clearly by looking at the age of these individuals. From this we can observe an aging population.

On the other hand, some languages are experiencing considerable growth across the county, such as Spanish. When looking at this population we can see there is considerable more youth and core working age individuals.
