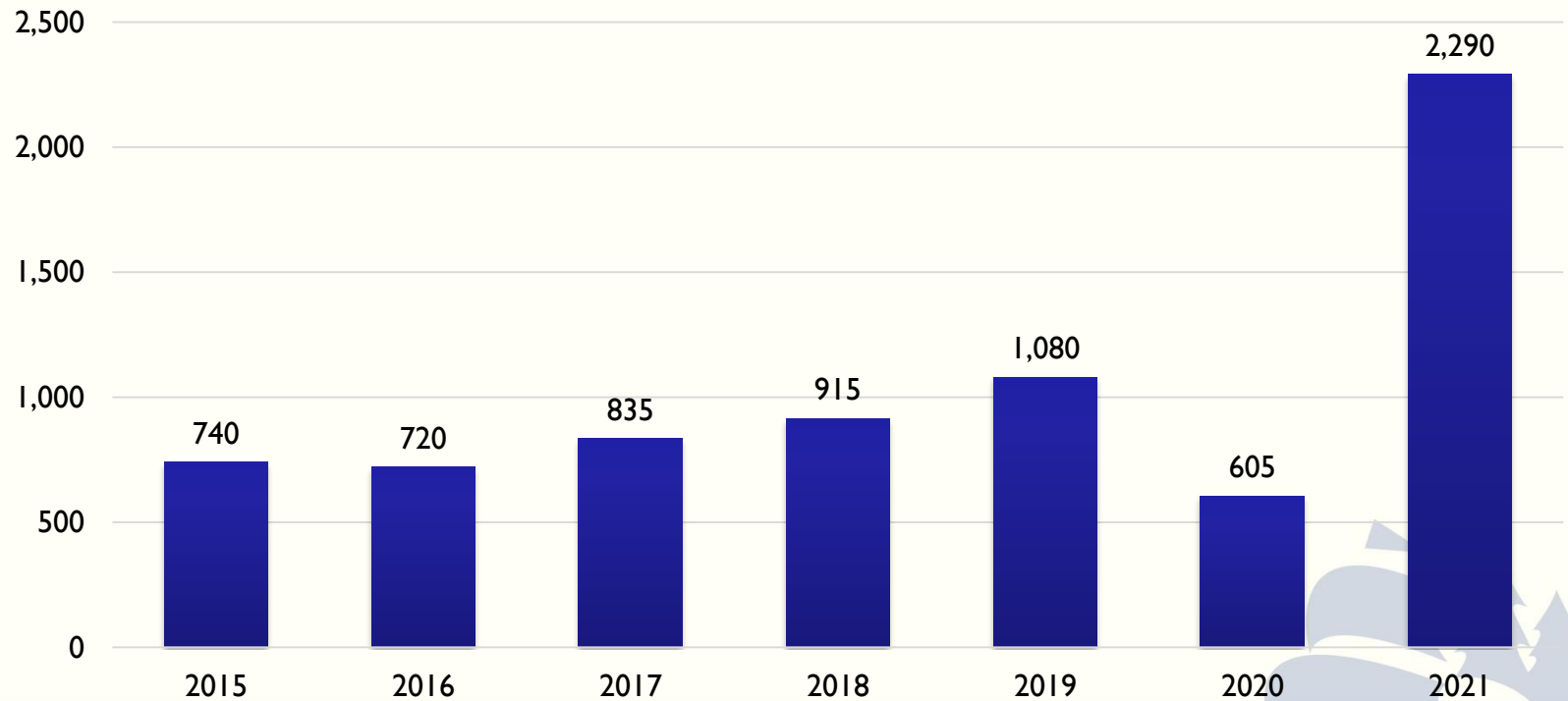
- Data set:

- Direct arrivals include:
 - New immigrants who moved to Canada
 - Temporary residents living in Canada that gained permanent resident status in that month
- Simcoe was the 23rd top Canadian census division region to welcome the highest number of new permanent residents in 2021

Total Annual PR Arrivals (2015-2021)

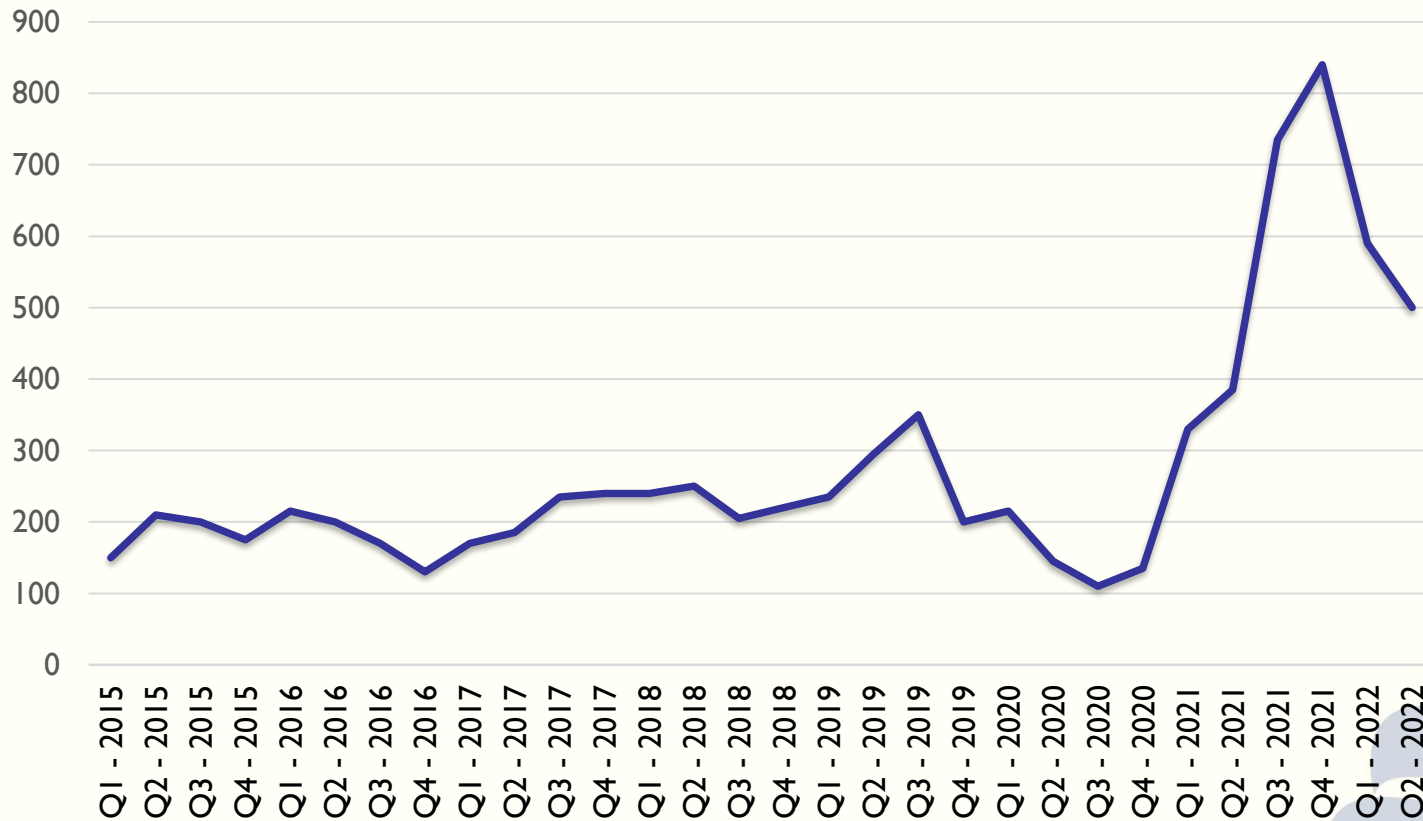

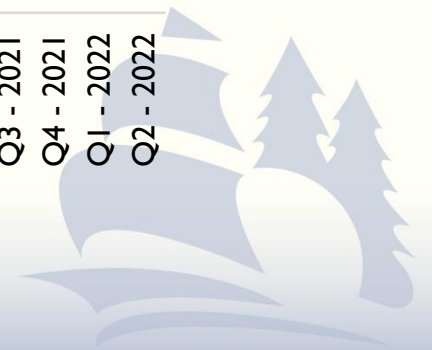
Simcoe County Quarterly Direct Arrivals (CD level)
