The creation of Family Councils in long-term care homes across Ontario is the result of an initiative by the Concerned Friends of Ontario Citizens in 1988. The increasing number of residents with some form of dementia, who are unable to participate meaningfully in Resident Councils and speak for themselves, underscore this need to develop autonomous Family Councils.

Who can be a member?

If you are a friend or relative of a resident of Simcoe Manor, you are welcome to join the Family Council as a Member. We also encourage relatives and friends of a deceased resident to continue their active membership, and to provide the benefit of their knowledge and experience.

When and where do we meet?

Virtual and in person meetings take place on the first Wednesday of the month unless an additional meeting is required. Meetings commence at 3 p.m. Meetings typically last 1.5 hours.
