- Ontario Caregiver Organization Alison Kilbourn, Bianka Varga
  - our original contact, Kailey Forster, was unable to attend today's meeting
     OCO is a not for profit organization providing essential partner support to caregivers has operated since 2018

- does not provide direct respite or therapy – provides services to caregivers for mental health and wellbeing – provides insight to government – works alongside other organizations – partners with Family Councils of Ontario, local health units, care settings

OCO can receive referrals from local LHIN's and also send referrals
 there are 4 million caregivers in Ontario – many are still working – 63% of caregivers are at/close to their breaking point – OCO tries to support caregivers before they are exhausted or burn out

- to maintain resilience, caregivers need to stay healthy and seek assistance

- OCO maintains a podcast called Time to Talk, also has a weekly email called 90 Second Letter containing helpful information and tips – provides webinars with caregiving information

- helpline available 24 hours a day every day – 1 833 416-2273 – important note, this is not a crisis line

- SCALE – 8 week program providing access to individual and group programming – how to partner with health professionals, mental health issues, information for

caregivers of people with mental health issues - provides volunteer opportunities and peer support, resources for Privacy and Caregorithe Care Dartner Current Link

Consent, and Essential Care Partner Support Hub

• End of life, palliative care - Betty Joseph-Director of Care

- Betty provided valuable information about palliative care – will return to our meeting in January/24 with other members of the palliative care team

- palliative performance scale assesses changing health status of a resident for end of life care

- palliative team respects choices of families and determines how to proceed with resident's care – appropriate medication, reduction of pain – provides palliative

care cart for families, possibly meals, care of chaplain, music, etc. as requested by families
