Primary vs. Secondary Sources

Primary Source:

A primary source is a document or object from the past created by people who lived during that time. Primary sources provide a view into an event or experience that only people living during that time could have experienced. Using a primary source, or an original document created by someone living in the past about their own experience, help to describe what the person in the past experienced.

Archives collect and preserve primary sources so that students can learn history from the experiences of people who were there. At an archives, primary sources are called records. At museums, primary sources are called artifacts.

Secondary Sources:

Secondary sources are documents people today write about the past. A secondary source is a document or recording that writes or speaks about information that is one step removed from the original source. The secondary source depends on the primary source or original source of the information. Secondary sources interpret, evaluate or discuss information found in primary sources.


